About the Role:

As CIEL's Animal Health Specialist you will help to identify the challenges and objectives to support the UK agrifood sector, with a focus on the role of animal health, welfare and behaviour. You will be able to develop and promote the adoption of innovative strategies from existing research as well as playing an intrinsic part in generating new research opportunities and building a joined-up approach across the sector.

You will be integral to shaping CIEL's offer to Members in this area, working with the Business Development team to define and initiate projects, promoting innovation and a collaborative approach.

You'll be adept at translating research for a wider audience, have a thorough understanding of farmed animal health challenges, particularly around endemic disease, antimicrobial resistance, welfare and behavioural issues, diagnostics and preventative health interventions.

A skilled and effective communicator you will work across stakeholders and Members to understand and balance animal needs, societal demand, environmental impact and productivity: increasing understanding, acceptance and uptake of innovative and sustainable practices and technologies. You will promote a One Health approach — animals, people and planet.

Main Duties:

- Work with CIEL Members, stakeholders, and the wider industry to:
 - Signpost access to R&D facilities
 - Encourage and build networks
 - o Produce evidence-based information to support industry and guide policymakers
 - Reduce barriers to research.
- Develop effective, collaborative relationships with key Members and stakeholders and have a proactive approach to establishing new relationships in the sector.
- Compiling budgets and forecasts, contributing to reports and monthly monitoring data.
- Acting as part of the management team, helping to set and deliver CIEL's strategic plans.
- Leading on the specialism within the organisation and in external interactions.
- Functionally managing team members in ad hoc project teams.
- Liaise with academic partners on current research directions and potential opportunities.
- Review existing research themes and outputs and identify areas where new research will
 aid the sector and where the existing research outcomes can be successfully applied.

- Ensure Members are kept up to date with developments in the field: identifying novel technologies and alternative practices.
- Represent CIEL at relevant conferences, seminars and workshops, promoting the central aim of developing an effective, coherent and thriving animal health sector.
- Support Members to implement new approaches and technologies for the management of risks associated with animal health, public health and food safety, productivity, sustainability and climate resilience.
- Provide scientific advice and technical support to the Business Development and Project teams.
- Support the Marketing and Comms team by providing input for Member newsletters, social media, CIEL reports and publications.
- Develop and present concept ideas and proposals to industry and academia: creating partnerships that can initiate research and drawdown appropriate funding helping to bring fresh thinking and new perspectives.
